ALLEN	Listing of 100 case notes of Jacob C. Allen, Attorney, who had offices in Hackettstown. Starting in 1875, New Jersey Supreme Court; Warren Circuit Court; Hunterdon Circuit Court; Morris Circuit Court; Somerset Circuit Court; The Chancery of NJ; Essex Circuit Court
ARMSTRONG	Record of the Descendants of Nathan Armstrong, an early settler of Warren County, NJ; born 1717; emigrated to US 1740; died 1777; eight branches of descendants.
ARNDT	Life, Antecedents and Descendants of Bernhard Arndt, emigrated to Penn in 1731; eight generations listed.
AXFORD	"Axford to Shaw" by Edna Cousins Shaw - John Axford came from Oxford, England in 1724. His wife was Anna Beach. Their children were Abraham, Samuel, Jonathan, John and Martha. There are descendants listed up to 1959. It was donated by Jeanne Mayberry.
AXFORD	"The Axfords of Oxford, NJ" was compiled by William Clinton Armstrong of Blairstown, NJ. The family genealogy beginning in 1725 is 78 pages. There is a 30 page Finding Aid to the booklet that indexed all the names There are 2 copies of the booklet.
BANGHART	"History and Genealogy of Jacob Banghart" Descendants - Michael, George, Barney, Amdrew and Mary each have a chapter. Published in 1968 by Frederick L. Mullin of Easton, Pennsylvanna.
BARTON	Benjamin Barton immigrated to Rhode Island, 1683; lists Barton Patriots/Veterans; Ancestral Emigrants; early marriage records; census, 1790; Short Biographies
BAYLOR	"The New Jersey Baylor Family" Johann Michael Baylor/Behler came from Rotterdam in 1741. He married Mary Runyan in 1774. There are photo copies of pictures of some of the family members. The nine generations were compiled by Jerome D. Bosley of Bellevue, Washington in 1992.

BELL & STIFF	"Bell & Stiff Families" Isaac Bell born about 1750 married Keziah Corwin in 1782. The family lived in Independence, Hope Township, NJ. Richard Stiff was born in 1777. He married Sarah Bell, daughter of Isaac and Keziah before 1804. This information was compiled by Robert G. Moore of St. Thomas, Ontario in 1994.
BERGEN	"The Bergen Family or the Descendants of the Early Settlers of Brooklyn and Long Island" was written by Teunis G. Bergen in 1896. It is 658 pages. It includes descendants of Hans Hansen Bergen who was born in Bergen, Norway. He emigrated to 1633 to New Amsterdam, New York - 6 generations.
BLAIR Academy	"Memories of Blair" by John C. Sharpe, Headmaster of Blair Academy, 1898-1927.
BOONE	"Genealogical History of the Descendants of George and Mary Boone" who came to America in 1717. Eleven Generations + Boone Families of Undetermined Connection + Allied Families
BOWLBY	Assorted papers and genealogies of different Bowlby branches and generations. Letters from descendants looking for church records of their ancestors. David Bowlby in 1834 and Ebenezer Bowlby born 1836 in Bethlehem Twsp., Hunterdon Co., NJ. John Bowlby was born 1760 in Hunterdon Co., NJ.
BROKAW	Brokaw Family Association - Related family names: Broucard, Brouchaert, Brogaw, Brokaw, Brocaw; originated in France; Huguenots.
BROWN	"Brown Family" William Brown was born in 1659 in Southhold, Suffolk County, NY. David Brown was born 1779 in Roxbury, Morris County, NJ. Articles from NJ and NY genealogy societies mention Brown Family members, The Calendar of NJ Wills 1771-1780. Extensive correspondence between Brown family members 2006 -2009.
BURKE	Supplement to Peerage and Baronetage and Landed Gentry by Ashworth P. Burke . Names from A to Y; listing lineage; coat of arms and mottos.
BURNS	Michael F. Burns (1854-1924) and wife Cora Butler Burns (1857-1900) - Burns Bros. Coal - Barry - Cavanagh
BUTLER	"Family Records of Revolutionary War Pension Applicants - Vol 1: Butler" 30 pension records with the descendants of Allen through Zebulon. An Index of place names and peoples names, commanding officers, clergymen, ... Published By Robert A. Butler in 1983. It is 102 pages.
BUTLER	Volumes 1 & 2 "Butlers Since 1857" Genealogy Research information There is 1 hard copy and 1 soft copy.

DE PUY/DE PUE	Du Puy/De Pue Story until Benjamin II, 1728-1811. It has the story of Benjamin II and the story of the two DePue. It has an Index of names nnd pictures of ancestors.
DEREMER	It includes descendants of Allert Deriemer. Peiter Alerts DeRiemer b.1570-1613, Netherlands. He married Margriete Sebnastian-Heidi. it was compiled by Lynn Reimer
DEREMER	It has over 1,000 descendants of Pieter Alertz De Riemer (1570-1613) Netherlands & Marguerite Sebastens (1571-?) of Belgium.
FIRTH and ARMSTRONG	FIRTH and ARMSTRONG of Warren County, NJ and Nyack, NY. Eli Firth 1805-1892 came from England. The immigrant Armstrongs settled in Warren County, NJ. Judge John Armstrong 1749-1836. There is a Haring Connection with Grandma Belle Haring 1781-1939. It was compiled by Firth Haring Fabend in 2013. It Includes geneeology maps, photos, newspaper articles and photos of tombstones.
FIRTH and ARMSTRONG	FIRTH and ARMSTRONG Family records of John Firth (1820-1879) and Mary Yardley Firth (1824-1892). It includes descendancy charts, ifo on 7 generations and some obituaries.

It has a table of contents and is 100 pages. It was compiled by the American Genealogical Research Institute in 1975.
GRIFFEN	"Jonathon Griffen" Ancestry and Descendants of Jonathon Griffen 1757-1837. This book has 12 generations and an Index of of 1,692 Individuals. The last person was born on 1978. It was compiled by Harry W. Griffen in 1983.
GROENDYKE	"Groendyke Family" It is the history and genealogy of the Groendyke family in the United States 1645-1950. This book was compiled by Howard H. Groendyke in 1950 it includes 9 Generations and has over 2,000 descendants listed.

HANCE	Descendants of Henery Hance, b July 1737, seven generations - allied families Bowers, Melick, Scott, Dunham and Richey. There is an Index and it is 112 pages.
HANEY	"The Linda Miller Haney Collection" Linda Arlain Haney compiled this collection in 1988. This 4" 3-ring binder has weddings, obituaries and events pertaining to the Miller and Haney Families and the town of Belvidere. It includes records from cemeteries in the area.
HANEY, WILSON, HOAGLAND and MILLER	This file contains family group sheets, obituaries and articles compiled by Linda Arlene Haney in 2015.
HARRIS and ROBERTS	"The History of the Families of Stanley Edwards Harris and Margaret Roberts Harris up to about 1932". It includes family photos. It is 207 pages by Stanley E. Harris. It includes a family tree chart, history of New Netherlands and Long Island.
HART	The Hart Family of New Jersey and Pennsylvania - The Wildrick Line was compiled by Wildrick Hart in 1988. It goes from John Wildrick 1707-1793 to descendants in the 1980s. There are Family Group sheets and Index of the 808 Individuals.
HART	The Hart Family of New Jersey of New Jersey and Pennsylvania - The Petty Line - Robert Petty (1786 -1831) Index of Surnames of Spouses - Application of Revolutionary War Pension, maps,.. compiled by Wildrick Hart in 1991.
HART	The Sussex County Hart Line - From Nathaniel Hart, died 1816, to descendants born up to the 1980s. Index of Hart Individuals and Index of Surnames compiled by Wildrick Hart in 1989.
HARTPENCE	The Hartpence Family in America 9 Generations - Joannes Eberhart Pence came from Germany. He settled in Hunterdon County in 1756. Included are an Index of Individuals, military records, deed, Bible record and a family will. It was compiled by Esther Leonard Heer in 1989.
HAWK	The Hawk Family of New Jersey and Athens, Ohio - Records in the 19th Century include Jacob D. Hawk (1803- 1880). Included are a List of Deeds, 1850 Census, Church Records, Marriage Records, Index of Hawk Names, Index to Surnames other than Hawk, biographies. It was compiled by Nancy Aiken and Beverly Schumacher.

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HENDERSON	Historial sites, photos of Henderson Farmsteads
HESS	Record of the Descendants of Nicholas Hess (b July 15, 1724) It spans nine generations, with photos and an index. It is 310 pages
HESS	Biographical sketches and many photos of the Nicolas Hess' descendants, seven generations up to 1911, index, 332 pages
HISSIM/HISSAM/HISSEM	"The Hissim, Hissam, Hissem Family History" was compiled by Marlin A. Hissim of Watsonville, California. Earliest ancestor was Thomas Hesom in 1745 in Trenton, NJ. Some family group sheets, records from Minisink Valley Reformed Dutch Church, New York and Middle Presbyterian Cemetery in Westmorland Co., Pennsylvania.
HORNBAKER	"The Descendants of John William Hornbaker I - A Family Genealogy" compiled by Lee Vaughn Hornbaker 1982 thru 1995. The patriarch, John William Hornbaker was born in Kentucky in 1817. This book is 189 pages and includes biographical sketches, some photos and an index.
HOWELL	"The Howells of New Jersey, Virginia and Points West" was compiled by Richard E. Wallace, Robert W. Cameron and Carmen J. Finley and published in 1994. Hugh Howell was born in 1720 possibly in New Jersey. His 1777 will is included. Some biographical sketches are included for the 175 descendants.
HOWELL	"The Howell Family" was published in 1976 by The American Genealogical Research Institute. There is a list of Howells who immigrated to America as well as early marriage records of Howells in the 1600s. It lists all the Howells in east coast states from the 1790 USA Census by state. There a biographical sketches of some family members and a list of Howell Patriots and Veterans. This book is 89 pages.
HOWELL	"The Descendants of Hugh Howell" by Janel Marie Howell & Jeannette Phethean in 2000. Ancestor Hugh Howell was born in Wales in 1659. Sampson Howell was born in 1718 Hunterdon County, New Jersey. Over 3,000 descendants are listed. The book has an index and it is 343 pages.
HOWEY	Connection of Howey families in the US and Canada,it has 18th century, maps, court documents, wills, descendant charts and a pedigree chart.
INNES	Ancestry and Kin of Robert Stewart Innes

JENNINGS	"The James Jennings of Northern New Jersey and His Descendants" by Michael Gesner in 2011. James lived in Pequannock, NJ and he died in 1818. Over 1,800 descendents have biographical sketches. The book is indexed and is 438 pages.
JONES	"Genealogy of the Jones Family" compiled by Norman E. Jones. There is a chapter of each of the following families: Chamberlain, Cole, Flumerfelt, Jones, Lantz, Lommason, Neigh, Prall, Smith, Stout and Vannatta. It is 60 pages and has some family charts, family tombstones.
JONES	"Jones Manuscript" by Norman Jones. This is the same as the previous entry.
JONES	Elias Jones, b. Nov 1, 1791, correspondence between researchers, with family group records, church and cemetery records, obituaries. and an index of wills.
KER	"A Quest for the Ancestors of Walter Ker" (1656-1748) compiled by Dora V. Karr and Randolph Karr. This book of 172 pages has information from Scottish records as well as biographical sketches about descendants as well as New Aberdeen, The Scotch Settlement in Monmouth County, New Jersey.
KERKOFF	"Urban Abraham Kerkhoff (1699 -1740 possibly from Germany lived in Readington, Hunterdon County, New Jersey) and his descendants" There are 4,736 descendants from 1699 to 1975. It is 697 pages with an index of individuals and has 11 generations. It was compiled by Michael Gesner in 2010.
KITCHELL	"Kitchell Family History" written by Deloris Kitchel Clem, Dwain L Kitchel in 1989. It covers Colonial Times thru the Korean War; starting with Robert Kitchell who arrived in New Haven, CT in 1639. It includes charts, maps and photos. It is 881 pages, indexed.
KNOX-MARTIN-WHITLOCK	"Knox-Martin-Whitlock Families" by Jeanne Waters Strong, 1999. This book is divided into 3 parts by family; the Knox family begins with Samuel Knox (c1760, Middlesex Co, NJ) down to Carrie Luella Knox (1930); the Martin family from John Martin (c1799, Hunterdon Co, NJ) down to Amanda Martin (1930); the Whitlock family from John Whitlock (c`1649, Essex Co, MA) down to Bessie Whitlock. It is 129 pages and has an been indexed.
KUHL	"The Kuhl Family of Hunterdon County, New Jersey" 1st. Edition by John N. W. Kuhk and Michael Gesner in 2012. It is 728 pages with an Index. There are 13 generations and 7,682 descendants.

KUNKEL	"Our Kunkel Family in America" written by Wallace M. Kunkel in 1980. It has 11 generations and 218 pages. The earliest ancestor was Johan Hynyrich Kunchel. It profiles of each of the children of Johan's son, Henry I, and their descendants. It photos and birth, marriage and death dates and locations.
LA BAR	"Reminiscences of George La Bar" this book was published in 1870. It has 8 chapters and 110 pages. George was born in 1763. There is an article written in 1938 with excerpts from his book.
LAKE	"Lake Family" includes the Last Will and Testament of John Lake (1786-1871) of Washington in Warren County, NJ. This 3-ring binder includes correspondence from ancestors to historical-genealogical societies looking for family records. There are some family names with birth, marriage and death information.
LAKE	"Sands of Time" organized by Marshall Lake in 1993. It includes a Table of Contents as well as an Index of Individuals. Descendants' birth, marriage and death and location information are included, if known. Some photos are included. Family names include Deckelman, Garrison, Kille, Lake, Lindaberry, Robins and Thayne.
LAMBERTSON	This informattion was compiled by Harold J Lambertson, c1992. It is in a 3-ring binder with charts, it mainly covers the Abram, Edward & George Lambertson lines. It includes family group sheets, records and letters. It is about 80 pages and has no index.
LAMONT	"The Thomas Lamonts in America" was compiled by Corliss Lamont in 1962. It has theories and stories of Lamonts in America plus individual biographies, poems, letters and a large family tree. It is 255 pages and has no index.
LOGAN	"In Memorial John T. Logan" (1809-1871) was published in 1885 by his youngest son. It is 62 pages and includes a photgraph of John T. Also included are descriptions of family life, business life and some correspondence.
LUNDY	"The Lundy Family and their descendants of whatsoever surname" It includes a biographical sketch of Benjamin Lundy by William Clinton Armstrong, A.M., published in 1902. It has an Index to the surnames and a Topical Index. Richard Lundy the First was born in Enland and died in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. Richard Lundy the Second was born in Pa in 1692 and died in 1772 in Warren County, New Jersey. Birth, marriage, death and location info is provided for the desendants. Included are some family photos.

LUNDY	"The Lundy Family and their Descendants Family History - Update 1902-2002 by Elise Schooley and Carolyn Drake Baley. It included The Lundy Family Pedigree. Many family group photos are included. Family names include Armstrong with Milne, Barba, Peterson, Johnson, Mullens, Harris, Kraft, and Abbot and Drake with Smith, Canfield, Evans, Sapp, Waters, Cebrynski, Thompson, Downhour, Williams, Polaski, Barnes, Fethrston, Wolfe, Baley and Schooley. Birth, marriage, death and location info is provided for the descendants.
LUNGER	"Descendants of Jacob Junger of Derrs [PA] 1811-1896" by Harold L Lunger, 1981; It begins with Joseph Lunger, 1741 of Warren Co, NJ and Northumberland, PA. It includes his ancestors and descendants. It is 101 pages and has no index.
MACKEY & ROSEBERRY	"Mackey & Roseberry Family Genealogies" This 3-ring binder includes notes and research on famly connections and other points of interest. Joseph Mackey (1741- ?) Captain in the Revolutionary War. John Roseborough (1753-?) Birth, mariage, death and location info for some descendants. Also included info about the Moelick Family of Lesser Cross Roads in Somerset County, NJ.
MARTIN	"Knox-Martin-Whitlock Families" by Jeanne Waters Strong, 1999; This book is divided into 3 parts by family; the Knox family begins with Samuel Knox (c1760, Middlesex Co, NJ) down to Carrie Luella Knox (1930); the Martin family from John Martin (c1799, Hunterdon Co, NJ) down to Amanda Martin (1930); the Whitlock family from John Whitlock (c1649, Essex Co, MA) down to Bessie Whitlock: 129 pages. indexed.
McCARTER	"Memorial of John McCarter and his Descendants" by Thomas D McCarter, 1900 (fragile condition). It has photos of Thomas N McCarter, Robert Harris McCarter, George H McCarter and James J McCarter. It is 132 pages and no index.
MELLICK	"The Story of an Old Farm or Life in New Jersey in the Eighteenth Century" by Andrew D. Mellick, Jr. in 1889. Moelich-Malick-Melick-Mellick. There is an Index of Individuals and the geneaology appendix of 5 generations. The book is 743 pages. Johan Wilhelm Moelich (1702-?) emigrated to America in 1735.
MILLER	"Grover Cleveland Miller & Adah Grace (Martin) Miller" by Linda Arlain (Miller) Haney, post 2017 (pre 2024). There are photos, articles, poems and other bits of genealogical interest. It is about 80 pages and no index.
MILLERS and HOARDS	"Millers and Hoards - includes Millers Grist Mill and Hords of Hoards" by C. Wayne Miller in 1991. It is 363 pages and includes an Index of Individuals.

MILLERS and HOARDS	It includes the descendants of George W. Miller and Francis A. Hoard. There are narrative chapters and family group sheets and pedigree charts. The Table of Contents includes chapters on the following families: Miller and Bretz, Parkinson and Overmeier, Miller and Carter, Jeffreys and Lay, Castleberry, Lovett, Caraway, Foster and Woodhouse.
MOODY	"Lt. Col. James Moody 1744-1809" This is a series of articles written in 1975 by Theodore Brush about the legendary Sussex County Loyalist and guerilla leader's life in America and then his move to Nova Scotia. The narrative tells of how he recruited men to serve in the Loyalist Army. It includes the timeline of Lt. Col. Moody's capture in 1780. There are a few family group sheets.
MORRIS	"Lewis Morris An American Statesman ca. 1613-1691" by Samuel Stelle Smith in 1983. This book has 4 generations of Morris in America. It has a Table of Contents and an Index of Names and is 136 pages.
MUNSON	"The Munson Record" by Myron Munson, Vol I & II, 1896; Capt Thomas Munson, 1612 and his descendants, lots of photos, maps, charts, records; 1235 pages, index in Vol II.
MUTCHLER	"Memorial Addresses on the Life and Character of William Mutchler" published by US Congress in 1893. Memorial addresses given by various members of the House of Representatives and Senate, 1893-1894. 96 pages, no index.
MUTSCHLER	"History of the Mutschler/Mutchler/Muchler Family and related families of Wihlem, Shoup, Hartman, Snyder, Kemp, Lewis, Kennedy, etc." Authored by Maxine Dart in 1991. (This is a revision of work done in 1980.) This 5" 3-ring binder has family group sheets. It includes some copies of photos as well as copied pages from the family Bible of Roseannah Shoup and her husband William Muchler.
NORCROSS	"Norcross Family and some of the descendants of William Norcross 1699 to America" was edited by Elsie M. Cameron in 1954. It is 82 pages, it has an Index of Individuals. There are 11 Generations. It has a descendant charts and birth marriage and death informations as well as some family photos including a 1914 Family Reunion photo with most of the individuals identified. 7 Generations.
PALMER	Palmer/Bowlby Families Descendants of Edmond Palmer, b. 1732-35, and Hannah Martha Goldsby; McCutchan, Gallagher, etc.

PARK	"Park Family" by William J. Green, list of Warren Co. Natives and Descendents buried in Bureau Co., Ill., info on Park family, census, marriage, Civil War, births, and Fancher, Stevenson, Anderson and Sayegh families,
PEARSON	"Crispin Pearson of Bucks County, Pennsylvania (1748-1806)" is a genealogy published by Annie Pearson Darrow in 1932. There are 733 descendants of Crispin. There is an Index of Individuals. A map of Solebury, PA showing the property owners and their lands.
